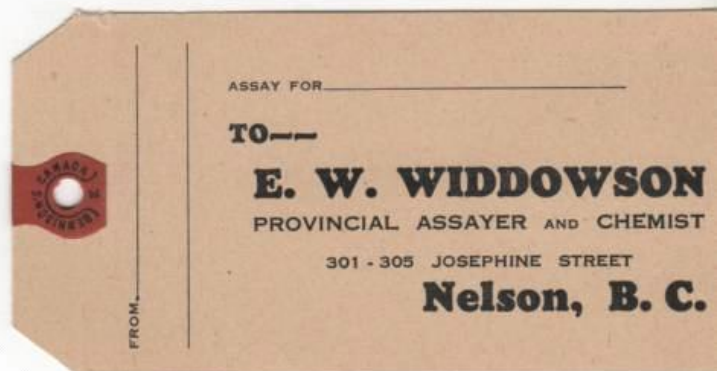
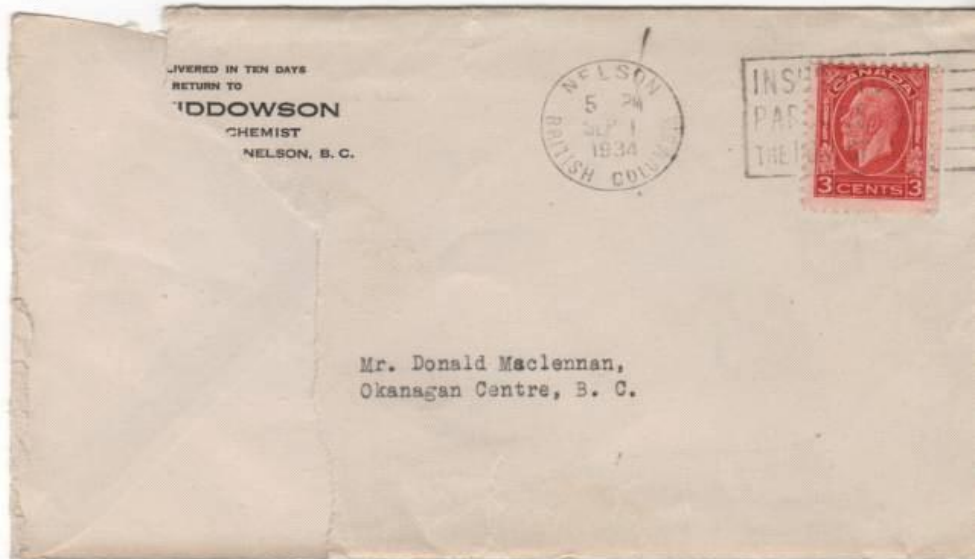
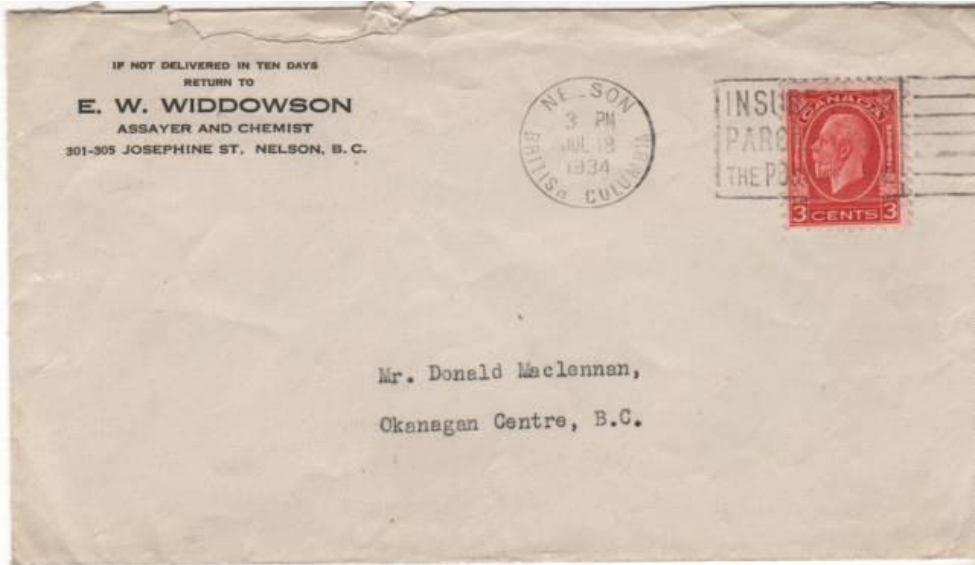

I have carefully watched this sample whilst the work was being done and do not think it will contain any other metals of commercial value than are given on the certificate.


You have some nice looking quartz in your sample and I would suggest that more prospecting be done where it came from with a view to finding stronger ore.

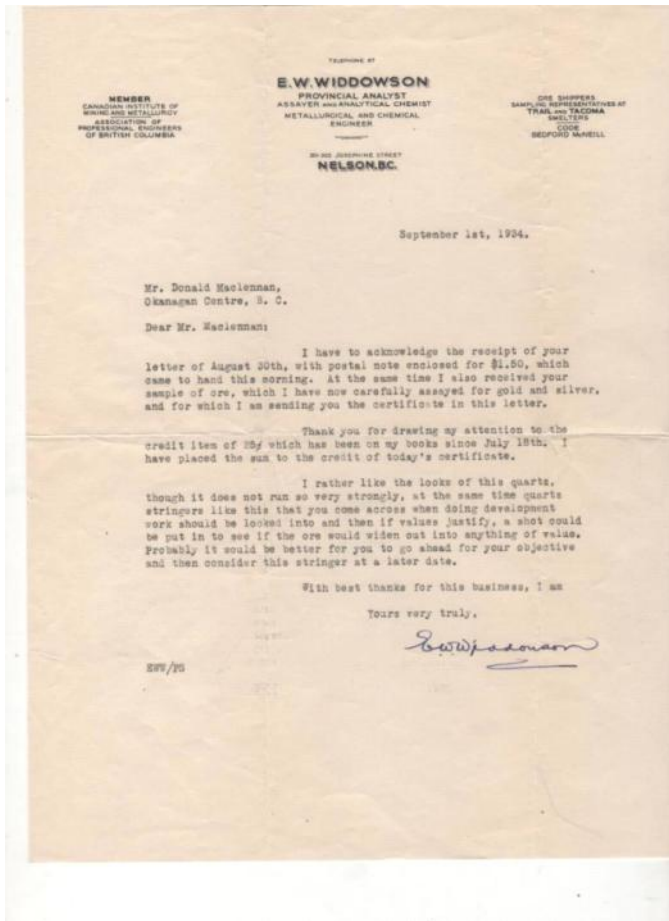

Thank you for drawing my attention to the credit item of 25¢ which has been on my books since July 18th. I have placed the sum to the credit of today's certificate.

I rather like the looks of this quartz, though it does not run so very strongly, at the same time quartz stringers like this that you come across when doing development work should be looked into and then if values justify, a shot could be put in to see if the ore would widen out into anything of value. Probably it would be better for you to go ahead for your objective and then consider this stringer at a later date.

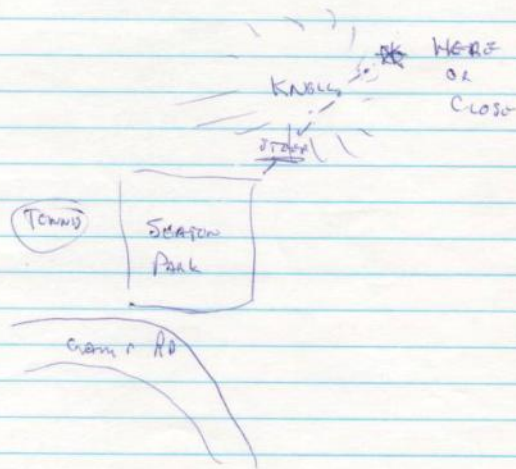
